Background and Context – An Introduction to the proposed development of excellent community sport and leisure facilities at Trentham Academy

We are extremely fortunate to have established a fabulous partnership with North Stafford Hockey Club, through shared values, passion, and commitment to offering the development of a superb hockey facility and multi-sport Artificial Grass Pitch. This facility is key to our vision of ensuring that the City Learning Trust Estate serves the local and wider communities in the most highly effective way. The provision of excellent facilities and resources which meet and serve the diverse needs of communities, supporting social, economic, health and well-being and environmental needs, firmly underpinned by strong corporate and social responsibility.

Moreover, this facility plays an integral role in the development of North Stafford Hockey Club, the primary and largest hockey club within Stoke-on-Trent and Newcastle-under-Lyme. This is in support of the



development of the Club's community outreach programme in conjunction with the City Learning Trust; formulating a long-term partnership, between our organisations in the development of the uptake of the sport hockey across the city. This development is an incredible opportunity for this partnership to have a significant impact across our community and revolutionise the position of the sport of hockey within the local area.

Working in partnership is critical to realising our vision of 'entitlement for all' and alongside our partnership with North Stafford Hockey Club, City Learning Trust and North Stafford Hockey Club are also delighted to have the support of England Hockey and Sport England.
