Dear Parents and Carers,

Phillip held my hand, as he lead the way, to a world where King's and Queens, are Monarch's every day.

I was given a crown to wear or a Halo known by some. The difference is up here, they are worn by everyone.

I felt a sense of peace, my reign had seen its end. 70 years I had served my Country, as the peoples' friend.

Thank you for the years, for all your time and love.

Now I am one of two again, in our Palace up above.

In an assembly filled with emotion, it was with immense pride that I looked out at 770 students, all of whom showed the greatest respect and were silent in their own reflection throughout.

We will continue to remember Queen Elizabeth during the period of national mourning. This will include inviting students to write in the online book of condolences that will be shared with the Royal family.

The academy will be closed on Monday 19 September for the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II.
