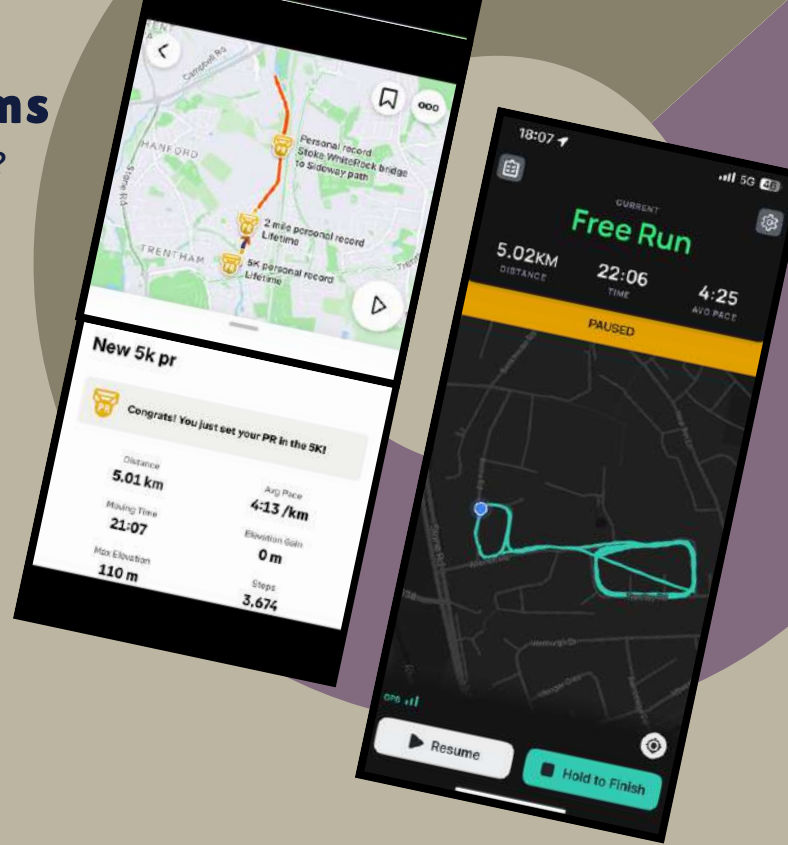

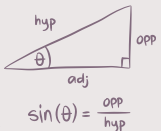
## Sparx Maths

Sparx Maths is an innovative online learning platform that gives students a personalised learning experience.

Students in Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 are set weekly homework on Sparx Maths which personalises the homework to the student.

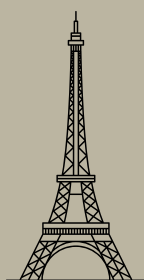
